The blessings of the four seasons in Korea only enhance the country's varied scenic pleasures such as the enchanting 'Spring' (March - May) flower blooms festivals and butterfly/ insects festivals as well, cycling and trekking trails lead the visitor across the beautiful and colourful display of nature.

'Summer' (June- August) takes the visitors onto the many splendid beaches/ coasts – Boryeong Mud Festival is very popular during this season, as are the fireworks, concerts, surfing and water games. Summer ends with heavy rainfall.

Then 'Fall' (September – November) has clear skies and lower temperature bringing about the fall foliage as evident in the glorious red, yellow and orange forests. Trekking, jazz festivals and more fireworks are in store during this season.




Last but not least, 'Winter', these are quite cool and winter sports at the various ski-resorts become the theme under the breathtaking snow-capped mountains. Ice Festivals, which include ice fishing, mountain trekking and sightseeing only manifest the abundance of climate, scenery and vibrant colour schemes that Korea offers throughout the year.

Few of the truly lavish sites that offer extravagant experience are as follows:

1. The Forest Resom in Jecheon, Chungcheongbuk do, is set in a forest with glamping villas and private decks. Since glamping is the modern form of exuberant camping, The Forest Room offers outdoor jacuzzis, forest trails, wellness programs and natural hot spring that enhances calmness and spa luxury.

2.Namhae Island has a coastal golf resort 'Ananti Namhae' that provides infinity pools facing the South Sea, hot spring baths, spa features and standalone penthouses. Here an extraordinary year-round indoor 'Water House' pool and Jjimjilbang (Public Bathhouse) style spas with an array of dining venues prevail. These are set across two peninsulas that are connected by a scenic footbridge leading visitors through lush hillsides to the ocean. A National Park (Hallyecohaesang), a Boriam Temple and other attractions like a German Village (a cultural project born out of Korean-German history) and an Oktoberfest are seen. Namhae Island sits on a hillside with the sea on one side and the Windbreak Forest and coastal drive on its other side, inducing a European meets Korean landscape feature.

3.Jeju Island is a very popular destination too and is a short flight from Busan or Wonju. It raises attention by being a volcanic island and has UNESCO heritage status. The JW Marriott Jeju serves breathtaking ocean view suites, private yacht or island cruises, sunset





beach walks, horseback rides, private tea ceremony and renders a volcanic stone spa to further dwell into its geographical wonders (it contains Hallasan National Park, Geomunoreum Lava Tube System, Korea's highest peaks, craters, long coastline and elite golf courses.

4.Another UNESCO site is Gyeongju. Proudly hosting the Bulguksa Temple and the Seokguram Grotto (a stunning granite cave built in the 8th century housing the Seokgamoni Buddha). This is a highly treasured Buddhist artwork and spiritual haven as well. Private guided cultural tours and ethnic hanok (old Korean house) dinners are available on request.

5. Jirisan in the southern part of Korea boasts of being the first national park, it reaches into three provinces, has the second highest peak in mainland Korea plus three sacred mountains, hermitage and historical temples and home to the famous Hwaeomsa Temple. The visitor is presented with forest healing, Zen meditation and organic dining in one of the most calm and stunning environments that include natural waterfalls, cherry blossoms in Spring, mists in Summer, forest foliage in Autumn and the captivating snow capped mountains during Winter.

With the rise of South Asian travel awareness and information, not to forget the best airport protocol facility offered i.e. Luxury / Business/ Medical/Family and Tailor- made Tours, Korea encompasses history, culture and nature added with spiritual wellness for those searching for an authentic travel destination adventure. Malta Military Heritage

Bastions, Baroque & Blood-Stained Legends

espite being one of the smallest countries in the world, Malta is a melting pot of cultures, an archipelago of sun-drenched coastlines and sleepy medieval charm, yet what truly sets Malta apart from other postcard-worthy destinations is its military heritage. I recently joined a curated four-day military heritage tour by Visit Malta, guided by Vincent Zammit—historian, author, and the human equivalent of a Maltese encyclopaedia. We explored prehistoric ruins, medieval bastions, UNESCO-protected sites, and even got a taste of Maltese gastronomy that still bears Roman influence.

We began at Borg in-Nadur, where Bronze Age ruins overlook St. George's Bay. Though worn and weathered, these stones tell stories of Malta's earliest fortifications. Then came the Tarxien Temples, a UNESCO-listed site dating back more than 5,000 years making them older than both the Egyptian Pyramids and Stonehenge. The stone carvings and sacrificial altars hinted at a Neolithic society who had already mastered defence and ritual.

In Rabat, we descended into St. Paul's Grotto, where the apostle is believed to have taken refuge after his shipwreck in 60 AD. From there, we entered Mdina, Malta's ancient capital and aptly nicknamed "The Silent City." Time seemed to pause inside its fortified gates. We wandered through narrow alleys and visited the Cathedral of St. Paul, a baroque masterpiece where the apostle met the Roman governor.

We then headed for a breezy walk across the fortifications of Mdina. These stone walls have protected Malta for over 3,000 years. Originally built by the Phoenicians and later reinforced by the Romans, Arabs, and the Knights of St. John, these massive walls encircle the Silent City like a timeless guardian and offer panoramic views of Malta.


That evening ended with a tasting at Meridiana Wine Estate, where Malta's arid land continues to produce surprisingly elegant wines, a nod to its Roman vinification legacy.

The next morning brought us to Tas-Silg, an archaeological site atop a Roman temple overlooking Marsaxlokk Bay. There, expert beekeepers from Golden Island led us through a honey-harvesting session. Malta's name, after all, is believed to come from the Latin melita, meaning honey.

We spent the afternoon in Birgu (Città Vittoriosa), the first home of the Knights of St. John after their arrival in 1530. On the Hospitallers Walking Tour, we visited the Church of St. Lawrence, where Mattia Preti's powerful Martyrdom of Saint Lawrence hangs. At the Victoriosa Museum, we saw Grand Master La Valette's actual hat and sword, relics from the 1565 siege, offered in thanks to the Virgin of Damascus.

After a hearty seafood lunch, we crossed to Fort Saint Angelo, the









Knights' wartime headquarters during that same siege. Standing atop its restored bastions, we looked out over the Grand Harbour, the very waters that once braced for Ottoman invasion.

That evening, we were treated to a magical open-air feast under the stars at Ta'Xmun Olive Grove. Between platters of game, Gbejna cheese, and rabbit stew, we sampled local olive oil and heard how these very groves once fed Malta through medieval wars and Arab preservation techniques.

The next day, we took the ferry to Gozo and visited the haunting fortifications of Citadella which was brutally attacked by the Ottomans in 1551 and nearly the entire population was taken

into slavery. Rebuilt by new settlers from Malta and Sicily, Gozo's Cittadella still carries the scars of war.

On our final day, we explored Valletta, Malta's glorious capital founded after the Great Siege. Designed as a fortified city by the Order of St. John, Valletta has withstood Ottoman attack, Napoleonic occupation, and WWII bombings, yet remains a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

At Upper Barrakka Gardens, once a private retreat for Italian knights, we enjoyed sweeping views of the Grand Harbour. Just below lies Fort St. Elmo, where the Knights made their legendary last stand in 1565. The National War Museum, housed within,














is an incredible walk through Malta's military chapters from medieval swords to WWII Spitfires.

We stopped briefly for Malta's beloved pastizzi, flaky pastries filled with ricotta or curried peas, before heading to the Grandmaster's Palace. Built in the late 16th century, it was once the seat of the Knights and later became the Governor's Palace under British rule. Today, it houses the Office of the President and a stunning collection of arms and armour in the Palace Armoury.

But the true showstopper in Valletta was St. John's Co-Cathedral. Modest on the outside, its interior explodes in Baroque opulence. Dedicated to different Langues of the Order, its floor is paved with the tombs of 400 knights, and in the Oratory hangs Caravaggio's "Beheading of Saint John the Baptist", a chilling masterpiece signed in blood.

In short, Malta is a dream! This sun-drenched archipelago is a living museum that feeds your curiosity and your palate in equal measure. Every alleyway whispers a tale, every vista begs to be photographed, but what truly sets Malta apart is its people; warm, welcoming, and deeply proud of their heritage. Whether you come for history, food, or just to gaze at the honey-gold coastlines, know this: Malta has more stories to tell than can ever be captured in four days.





Carinthia, AUSTRIA

A Wellness Escape Between Mountains, Lakes and Myth

5 ometimes, the best kind of escape is the one where nature, wellness, and legend collide. I traded the sweltering heat of Dubai for the lush, alpine calm of Carinthia, Austria's southernmost state, and what awaited was a soul-refreshing week of healing waters, mythical stories, and scenic landscapes painted in lake blues and mountain greens.

Carinthia's prime location lets travellers explore Austria, Italy, and Slovenia in one trip, just minutes from each border. Carinthia is home to over 1,200 lakes and rolling mountain ranges, many of which transform into ski havens by winter. But in summer, the region glows even brighter, offering breezy weather, crystal-clear waters, and endless nature trails. The kind of place where you can swim in a lake so clear and pure, its waters are drinkable!

We landed in Ljubljana, Slovenia on a 6-hour Fly Dubai flight, and took a scenic drive into Klagenfurt, Carinthia's capital, where cobbled streets, charming cafes, and centuries-old legends await. At the heart of town stands the Lindwurm Fountain, a monumental dragon carved from slate in 1583. The locals believe this mythical creature once roamed the marshes until slain by knights who lured it with a booby-trapped bull. Klagenfurt, derived from "wailing crossing," was said to be built in its wake.

Other local legends are just as captivating. In the town centre, we found the Wörtherseemandl, a bronze figure of a little man with his finger raised in warning. According to lore, this little man flooded a wealthy, arrogant city that refused to attend Christmas mass, creating today's Lake Wörthersee, the largest and clearest in the region.

At Lake Wörthersee, we dined at Maria Loretto, watching the sun melt into turquoise waters. The next morning, we boarded a nostalgia bus to the ferry and glided across the lake to Maria Wörth, a quaint village framed by mountains and wildflower meadows. The panoramic views of Carinthia from Pyramidenkogel, the world's tallest wooden lookout tower, was breathtaking, and for thrill-seekers like me, you can opt to slide down the tower instead of taking the elevator!





Lunch at Linde restaurant was an absolute treat with lakefront views, and the freshest seafood. We then drove to Velden, Carinthia's shopping and casino capital, where tradition and glamour coexist with ease, and had a tea-party by the lake at the elegant Schlosshotel.

From here, we shifted into full wellness mode at the luxurious Hotel Warmbaderhof in Warmbad-Villach. For over 200 years, this 5-star spa resort has been a sanctuary for wellness seekers. My room overlooked lush gardens and came with a scent of lavender and fresh fruit, an invitation to slow down.

Each morning, I soaked in the hotel's Healing Thermal Water Pool, which sits directly above a natural thermal spring. Said to alleviate pain, improve circulation, and reduce inflammation, this healing water replenishes itself every three hours. It's no wonder Warmbaderhof has a loyal international following.

The spa's VIBE facial introduced me to a skincare line inspired by the goddess of thermal springs. But the boldest moment came in the -110°C Cryo Suite. For three icy minutes, I stood in a freezing chamber, and emerged recharged. Cryotherapy has benefits ranging from pain relief and muscle recovery to better circulation and boosted mood.

Wellness in Carinthia isn't limited to spas. We hiked through Monkey Affenberg (Monkey Mountain), an outdoor enclosure where we





encountered adorable Japanese macaques with a trained guide and got a glimpse of their daily antics and wittiness in their natural habitat.

Another highlight was the drive through Nockberge Biosphere Reserve, a UNESCO-listed haven of biodiversity. Along the way, we explored a museum dedicated to trees and wood sustainability and even sipped on local schnapps made from tree saplings. For lunch, we dined at a local restaurant, and feasted on traditional homemade Austrian ricotta dumplings, an absolute treat!

For those dreaming of an alpine escape with rustic charm, Carinthia doesn't disappoint. Gipfelhaus Magdalensberg offers panoramic views, regional cuisine, and cozy lodge-style comfort over 1,000 meters above sea level, perfect for hikers and history lovers alike. Meanwhile, Trattler's Hofchalets in Bad Kleinkirchheim combine luxury with nature: think private saunas, fireplaces, and direct access to ski slopes and hiking trails.

I headed home with a glowing body, mind, and spirit. Carinthia's healing waters, crisp air, and charming folklore had worked their magic. The weather in late spring was just right: warm sun, cool breeze, and food so fresh it tastes like summer. I am already dreaming of going back with a few friends in tow to swim in its crystal-clear lakes and soak up the lush, vivid beauty all over again.
